EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

Over the past three years, the context of human services has changed drastically, with homelessness rising by 12% nationwide. As nonprofits like Shelter House have stretched to meet the needs of the community post-pandemic, we have been pushed to grow, adapt, and most of all – to respond.

At Shelter House, we responded to the growing crises of homelessness and domestic violence by rapidly expanding and increasing our services. In all ways, we are doing more – operating more programs, serving more people, and providing more comprehensive support to each household we serve. As a result, we are serving nearly 700 more people each year than we served prior to the pandemic - a 63% increase in individuals served.

In many ways, the past three years have been a sprint. Our team has worked quickly and tirelessly to meet the needs of the community, and we are not the same organization today that we were three years ago.

It is with this backdrop of growth, expansion, and change that we developed our FY2025 - FY2027 Strategic Plan, gathering feedback from Shelter House staff and leadership via anonymous surveys, group listening sessions, Town Halls, team brainstorming sessions, and individual interviews. The feedback from our dedicated team established a clear path forward – over the next three years, our focus as an organization is on stabilizing, sustaining, and ensuring a strong foundation for future growth.

Shelter House's mission is more important than ever, and it is through this plan that we will continue to make a lasting impact in our community for years to come. Our team is excited to get started, and grateful for the continued support of our wonderful volunteers, donors, funders, and partners. With your support, we are changing lives.

Our History

Changing Lives for Over 40 Years

Shelter House, Inc. was founded in 1981 as a grassroots responder to the homelessness crisis in Fairfax County when community volunteers from several ecumenical groups joined together to help address the needs of their homeless neighbors. They started by providing direct emergency assistance such as food, blankets, and warm clothing, distributed from the trunks of their cars.

The tragic hypothermia death of a homeless man on Christmas Day in 1983 galvanized the community to do even more. Churches opened winter shelters, and Shelter House volunteers and others advocated to Fairfax County Government to devote more public resources to the homeless. As a result of this advocacy, Shelter House secured a County contract in 1985 to open one of the first homeless shelters in Fairfax County. Today, Shelter House provides a spectrum of homeless services and housing solutions to prevent and end homelessness and domestic violence in Northern Virginia.


FY 25 - FY27 | Goals & Objectives
